CVUSD Outreach Program offers English classes for adults:

Free and available via zoom or in person in 3 different locations, mornings and evening classes.

Presentation about Career and Technical Education



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The district offers a Career Pathways program at all 4 high schools in CVUSD where students can experience a more work based learning and get introduced to the different sectors of the industry.

This coursework helps them to figure out what their future career/passion might be and it gets them ready for their future work life. It's a very hands on program and gives the students invaluable perspective and insight. They do informational interviews, job shadowing, Business tours and internship, etc.

It's offered after school, it's a year long program and most of the classes are for 11th and 12 graders a view even for 10th graders

### Presentation about the ELPAC and Reclassification progress

The ELPCA is the English Language Proficiency Assessment of California.

Currently there are 1905 English Learners in the district

It'a a computer based test where students get tested in Listening, Speaking, Reading and Writing to see if they need help with the English language.

ELPAC testing starts on February 2nd and is going through mid March. Parents get notification in the mail if their kids get tested.

Reclassification is the process whereby a student is reclassified from an English learner to Fluent English.

This process can get started when they either reach ELPAC Level 4 or through teacher evaluation or because the parents think they are ready to exit the program.

CVUSD reclassifies twice a year (after trimester 1 in November and after trimester 2 in March) This school year already 179 students have been reclassified and left the program.

### **GATE Report:**

Review of LCAP, SPSA, SARC and Dashboard presentation — An overview of the LCAP and SPSA was given. There was such robust discussion about a GATE-DAC rep's role in SSC and the SPSA process that it was tabled to the April meeting for further discussion. We are hoping to discuss ideas and/or strategies on how to integrate GATE into the SPSA.

#### **Unfinished Business:**

#### **New Business:**

Tim McCabe presented a history and update on our Measure I Funds.

- Facilities Master Plan was created in 2015. Needs identified at that time included -Shade, new fencing for kinder yard, upgraded play structure, Expanding kitchen and lunch shelter, permanent outdoor tables, new MPR
- Estimated cost with new MPR = \$6 Million
- Currently there is \$1.5 Million left in the Measure I budget for WLE
- Student Pavillion concept budget = \$1.2Million
  - New pavilion needs to move from the current lunch area in order to maintain setbacks from the buildings due to sprinkler system regulations
- This concept is currently in DSA (Dept of State Architecture) plan check, with permit expected in early summer
- WLE will be receiving 2 new playgrounds in 2022/23 and in 2023/24
  - o 2022/23 Kinder Playground, budget \$150K
  - o 2023/24 Primary Playground, budget \$190K
  - o Additional funds raised by the PFA can be used to supplement these budgets
  - These funds are part of Measure I but are separate from our current \$1.5
    Million budget
- We will follow-up with Tim McCabe and other planning committee members to go over updated plans in a few weeks

Mrs Culpepper gave a presentation on ELO-P (Expanded learning Opportunities)

- These will be offered beginning late March/early April
- Offered to EL, Foster, and SED students first
- SSC completed survey to indicate our greatest needs for our school population
  - Homework help and physical activity were on the top of the list
